## Valentines Day

February is the month of Love. We have Valentine's Day with its assortment of Valentine's Day cards, candied hearts and chocolate, red attire and flowers. Valentine's Day is the one holiday with the greatest number of flowers sold! Around 250 million roses are sold with red roses making up 83% of the sales with \$2.6 billion dollars spent in 2024 (this is according to A1).

While we show our love for one another through cards, candy and flowers, I began to think about how love is shown in the Bible.

We see love when God sent Jesus to redeem us from our sin through his death on the cross in 1 John 4:9-10; we see his Covenant of unfailing love in Isaiah 54:10 and we see the depth of God's love for us in Genesis 22.

Because God loves us, we desire to love others by bearing one another's burdens as found in Galatians 6:2. 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 reminds us what love is and love spurs us to building one another up in Philippians 2:3.
